## Obstetrics Department Update



#### Obstetric Department Statistics – Post Covid-19

The department had 950 deliveries in 2022. The Cambodian team of doctors and midwives was faced with increasing competition by private providers who catered more to customers' demands. At the beginning of the year, activity was very low. A quality improvement project focused on customer services in the Women's Health Clinic and the maternity wing. As a result, the number of deliveries increased in the second half of the year by 47 % compared to the first six months. In addition, the department was a sought-after referral site for difficult deliveries and cases of postpartum bleeding due to our well-functioning blood bank. Many lives have been saved thanks to the hospital's blood bank.

Following severe bleeding, she was transferred from another hospital to Sonja Kill Memorial Hospital, where the medical team acted swiftly, providing urgent and professional care that ultimately saved her life.

# HOSPITAL STAFF AND VOLUNTEERS STEP IN TO DONATE LIFE-SAVING BLOOD

In Keo Krasang Village, Kep Province, a 44-year-old widow and housewife faced a life-threatening situation while pregnant, putting both her life and that of her unborn child at risk. She has two children, a son and a daughter, but due to severe financial hardship, her son has been unable to receive a proper education. Additionally, a few months ago, her eldest son was involved in a traffic accident while working to support the family.

Currently, she and her children do not have a home of their own and are living with her younger sister's family. They rely on scavenging for recyclable materials to sustain their livelihood. On top of these challenges, she suffers from multiple chronic illnesses, making it difficult for her to find stable employment.

While her eldest son was recovering from the accident, she was deeply worried as a mother. After dedicating her time to caring for him, she discovered that she was already five months pregnant.

Determined to protect her unborn child, she followed the doctors' advice to maintain her health. However, tragically, the baby did not survive and passed away at birth.

# ANOTHER VICTORY FOR THE NEONATAL INTENSIVE CARE UNIT

The Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) at Sonja Kill Memorial Hospital is a bright light to many parents whose newborn babies are born premature or sick. It is the only neonatal intensive care unit for many miles and features

Ms. Pok Sreytom hugged her baby tightly, smiling with relief after enduring the storm of life during and after childbirth. At 36 years old, she had finally conceived for the first time. Due to financial hardship and malnutrition, she went into labor prematurely at just 26 weeks and gave birth at another hospital. Although the delivery was successful, her baby weighed only 800 grams and was in critical condition.

Doctors at that hospital advised her to take the fragile newborn to Sonja Kill Memorial Hospital. As newcomers to Kampot, Ms. Pok Sreytom and her 74-year-old husband, a foreigner, had never heard of the hospital before. They worried about the quality of medical care and the potential costs, but with no other choice, they made the journey in hopes of saving their baby. Upon arrival, their fears were quickly put to rest. The baby was placed in an incubator for two months, receiving specialized neonatal care from the dedicated medical team. Under their careful supervision, the infant grew stronger and gained weight, reaching 2,390 grams. Their experience turned out to be the complete opposite of what they had feared. From the moment they stepped into the hospital, they felt the kindness and compassion of the staff.

"Without Sonja Kill Memorial Hospital, I would have lost my only child," said Ms. Pok Sreytom. "You have not only saved my son but have shown compassion to my family, without discrimination against our livelihood or nationality. I hope that when my son grows up, he will become a good doctor—one who helps the needy and serves society, just like the doctors at Sonja Kill Memorial Hospital."

#### **EMPLOYEE SPOTLIGHT #1**

Recognizing the increasing demand for specialized digestive health services, the hospital established the GI Department to offer comprehensive diagnostic and therapeutic care for patients with gastrointestinal conditions. The GI Department is equipped with state-of-the-art endoscopy units, advanced imaging systems, and modern diagnostic tools to ensure accurate assessments and effective treatments. Our facilities include:

- Endoscopy suites designed for both upper and lower GI procedures
- Comfortable recovery areas that prioritize patient safety and comfort

Our dedicated team, consisting of highly skilled gastroenterologists, endoscopy nurses, and support staff, is committed to providing compassionate care. Continuously trained in the latest GI procedures, our specialists maintain their expertise through ongoing education and collaboration with leading medical institutions. The GI Department offers a full range of services, including:

- Diagnostic endoscopy (upper GI endoscopy, colonoscopy)
- Therapeutic procedures (such as polyp removal and variceal banding)

Since its opening in early 2024, the GI Department has already made a meaningful impact, successfully:

- Treating [111] patients with a variety of gastrointestinal conditions
- Performing [80] endoscopic procedures with high safety and success rate

By providing these specialized services locally, we've enhanced access to critical healthcare for our community, reducing the need for patients to travel long distances for care. As we continue to grow, Sonja Kill Memorial Hospital remains dedicated to expanding our specialized services, ensuring quality healthcare is accessible to all.

#### **EMERGENCY MEDICINE DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS**

#### Dr. Kuoy Sopheak,

Senior Resident in the ED/IPD of SKMH

In 2024, the Emergency Medicine Department continued its important role in providing 24/7 life-saving care. Dr. Kuoy Sopheak, Senior Resident in the ED/IPD, highlighted the department's major achievement—the introduction of a short ICU care unit, which improved patient management and critical care transitions. The department also experienced a rise in patient volume due to faster evaluations, improved management, strong teamwork, and the use of advanced medical equipment such as ventilators and defibrillators.

Common emergencies treated included respiratory illnesses (pneumonia, COPD), cardiovascular conditions (stroke, myocardial infarction), gastrointestinal issues (AGE, gastritis, appendicitis), pediatric cases (URI, pneumonia), and trauma injuries (fractures, head trauma).



In the face of urgency, we stand strong saving lives, offering hope, and making every second count.



While the department made significant progress, challenges remained, particularly in managing critically ill patients while addressing concerns from anxious family members. This was resolved through teamwork, communication, and multidisciplinary collaboration.

A notable success story this year was a critically ill patient who arrived in severe condition. Thanks to the department's swift response, advanced equipment, and expert care, the patient was stabilized and recovered successfully—a testament to the team's dedication and efficiency.

To enhance emergency care, staff participated in BLS, ACLS, ATLS, and emergency training programs, ensuring continuous skill development. Additionally, new medical equipment improved response times and patient outcomes, though further resources are still needed. Looking ahead, Dr. Sopheak emphasized strengthening the triage system, teamwork, and critical care programs, while also improving professionalism, leadership structure, and emergency case prioritization. With these advancements, the department remains committed to delivering high-quality emergency care and saving lives.
